INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Fund, operating as a fund-of-funds, seeks to achieve for its Participants capital appreciation and income by investing in a diversified portfolio of global fixed income collective investment schemes which integrate environmental, social, and governance criteria in its investment process, including the incorporation of sustainability goals and facilitation of flow of funds towards green economic activities, climate change mitigation and adaptation projects, and other positive environmental and social impact initiatives. The Fund aims to outperform its benchmark which is the Bloomberg Barclays Global Aggregate Bond Index (Unhedged).

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process shall be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, before deciding to invest.

The BPI Invest Sustainable Global Bond Fund-of-Funds is for investors who:

• Are at least classified as moderately aggressive based on their risk profile.

• Have an investment horizon of at least five (5) years.

Participation in the Fund shall be open to Participants with legal capacity to contract and who are not considered US persons under the US securities and tax laws, subject to the other conditions, rules or provisions stated in the Plan Rules and those established by the Trustee. No beneficial owner shall hold more than 10% of the Fund. Any investor who owns more than 10% shall be asked to redeem the amount (or its equivalent number of units) in excess of 10% within thirty (30) calendar days.



OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. Global fixed income markets declined in August as persistently high inflation drove expectations of a more aggressive monetary policy tightening from central banks. Federal Reserve Chair Jerome Powell signaled in his Jackson Hole Symposium speech that the central bank will continue to focus on bringing down inflation and will likely adopt a restrictive monetary policy stance 'for some time'.

US treasury yields rose and inverted at some parts of the curve amid the continued hawkish tone of global central banks. The US 2-year, 10-year, and 30-year rose by 61, 54, and 28 basis points, ending the month at 3.50%, 3.20%, and 3.29%, respectively. Riskier fixed income assets were mixed against comparable government bonds, with the US investment-grade as the worst performing sector for the month. Corporate credit spreads narrowed, with global investment-grade, global high-yield, and emerging-market credit narrowing by 0.7, 16.3, and 45.8 basis points, respectively.

Fund Performance. The fund returned -2.38%, outperforming the benchmark by 157 basis points. Security selection and cash allocation helped performance.

Fund Strategy. Inflation will impact every sector of the economy in 2022 and identifying companies able to thrive in this new environment is likely to be increasingly important. In navigating this period, some of the major structural trends that had been occurring previously have accelerated; such as the increasing market share of electric vehicles sold, increased recycled content in clothing and packaging, and record installations of wind turbines and solar panels. The recent Russia-Ukraine war has resulted in the world, particularly Europe, determined to reduce their reliance on traditional sources of energy such as oil and gas, requiring large investments in renewable energy in the coming years. We believe that strong ESG companies are likely to generate positive financial performance over time as investing in sustainability can deliver higher growth and returns through innovation, higher operational efficiency and better risk management.

LIST OF PROSPECTIVE INVESTMENTS

The following are among the Fund's approved investment outlets, wherein the Trustee intends to invest depending on strategy, availability, or other market-driven circumstances:

- (a) Primarily in more than one collective investment scheme managed using a sustainable investment strategy aligned with sustainability metrics European frameworks Union Sustainable or such as the Finance Disclosure Regulation (SFDR), United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDG), and other globally approved recognized fund rating agencies or companies, that are or registered and supervised by regulatory authorities that is a member of the International Organization of fund Commissions (IOSCO) by reputable Securities and managed manager/s the investment objectives and policies of which are generally consistent with those of the Fund; provided further combined investment in collective investment schemes should not fall below that such ninety percent (90%) of the net asset value of the Fund. The Target Fund must be recognized as a collective investment scheme in its home jurisdiction by a regulatory authority or any regulatory authority acceptable to the BSP to supervise this CIS.
- (b) Deposit products;
- (c) Money market instruments;
- (d) Short-term tradable fixed-income instruments issued, underwritten, or otherwise dealt by BPI and/or any of its subsidiaries, affiliates, their successors-in-interest or assignees, their directors, officers, stockholders, and related interest, and any of their trust and fund managed accounts, under such terms and conditions as the Trustee may deem to be in the best interest of the Fund; and, any such other instruments as may be allowed under BSP regulations. Investment with related interests shall be in accordance with Section 414-Q of the Manual of Regulations for Non-Bank Financial Institutions;
- (e) Such other investments suitable to the nature, classification, and strategy of the Fund, as allowed by prevailing regulations.
- (f) The principal investments of the Fund will be denominated in, but not limited to, the following major currencies: U.S. Dollar, Euro, British Pound, Canadian Dollar, Australian Dollar, Swiss Franc, Danish Kroner, and Japanese Yen.
