The fund is suitable for investors who:

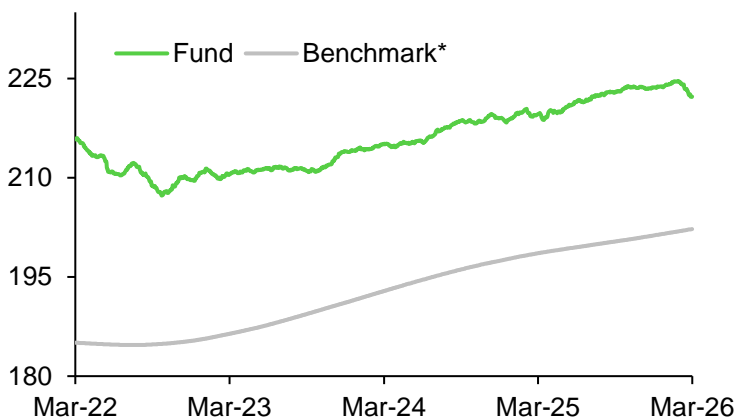
- Are at least classified as **moderately aggressive** based on their risk profile.

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. The month of March saw volatility mainly from the US-Iran war. The conflict caused a sharp rise in oil and energy prices as the attacks on energy infrastructure caused Brent crude prices to reach above \$100. The closure of the Strait of Hormuz squeezed the supply of key inputs, not just oil but also LNG, petrochemicals, and fertilizer to name a few. ECB policy makers signaled readiness to raise rates as needed if the fallout from the Iran war pushes inflation too far, and do not discount the possibility of raising rates in April. EUR-denominated bonds experienced significant selling pressure for the month of March. Yields rose sharply across government and corporate bonds. The 10-year German Bunds rose 29 bps, French Oats by 43 bps, and Italian BTP by 55 bps. The short-end also saw selloffs as risk to inflation rose as the war dragged on through mid-March. The Bloomberg European Aggregate Total Return Index declined by 2.1% for the month. By end of the month, yields looked to be calmer with hopes of de-escalation.

Fund Performance. The Fund returned -1.02% for the month, underperforming its benchmark by 119 basis points. Year-to-date, return amounted to -0.63%, underperforming its benchmark by 112 basis points.

Fund Strategy. The Fund looks to maintain a nimble portfolio position to take advantage of any opportunities as global inflation is seen to increase over the next few months as an effect of the higher oil prices and bottleneck in seaborne trades. Volatility may persist in the near term driven by global factors, and the portfolio will be actively managed to take advantage of this. Investors in the bond fund must be prepared to withstand volatility as higher investment value is normally achieved over the medium to long term horizon.
