OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY			

Key Contributions to Portfolio Outcome: Rising interest rates continued to weigh on markets in September with both risky and safe haven assets selling off leading to negative returns across most markets in the third quarter. The fund delivered a negative return this quarter. Key contributors to portfolio income this quarter were high yield, covered calls, and floating rate loans. Interest rate management positions, global infrastructure equities, and global ex-US equities were the largest detractors from total return this quarter offset by floating rate loans, currency management positions, and high yield which contributed to returns.

Main Portfolio Changes: Overall, we remain measured in our approach given surging sovereign yields and the risk of a policy misstep. Given the wide range of potential outcomes, our preference has been to maintain a relatively balanced risk profile. Earlier in the quarter, we took advantage of the pick-up in volatility to increase covered calls. However, we offset this by reducing equities given the still uncertain backdrop and not wanting to meaningfully increase risk. We also took advantage of the selloff in interest rates to again add duration given the cloudy outlook. More recently, we've taken steps to rotate away from high yield and floating rate loans after they performed strongly in Q3 versus equities, choosing to own more to covered calls to take advantage of higher volatility.

Positioning & Outlook: Rising interest rates continued to weigh on markets in September with both risky and safe haven assets selling off. The Federal Reserve remained on hold at their September meeting, yet most voting members pencilled in one additional rate hike in 2023. Similarly, rate cuts in 2024 have been pushed back as investors price in a higher for longer environment. Even though inflation has continued to moderate in both the US and Europe, rising fuel prices, heavier treasury supply, and potential monetary policy changes in Japan have all been catalysts for higher global yields. The result has been a challenged backdrop for both stocks and bonds since the end of July. Within equities, real estate and utilities sectors have been among the worst performers, while the energy sector has rallied. Across fixed income, duration-sensitive assets struggled as the 10-year treasury hit its highest level since 2007. Credit fixed income sectors have continued to outperform, notably floating rate exposures that have benefited from higher coupons and limited duration risk. Our base case remains that the US economy will avoid a hard landing scenario in the near-term as recent data indicate an improvement in activity and momentum. A further drop in inflation should also allow real incomes to rise across US consumers, further supporting US economic resiliency in our view. Additionally, total nonfarm payrolls came in significantly above expectations with upward adjustments in the prior two months as well. Meanwhile, we expect central banks to maintain a higher for longer stance as inflation, though moderating, is likely to stay above targets for the fore seeable future. Added uncertainty from conflict in the Middle East and the potential for higher oil prices also mean investors should proceed with some caution.
