INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Fund aims to achieve investment returns that closely track the total return of a U.S. dollar-denominated index, the JP Morgan Asia Credit Philippines Total Return Index, before fees and taxes, by investing in a diversified portfolio of Philippine sovereign and corporate fixed income instruments.

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process shall be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, before deciding to invest.

The BPI Invest Philippine Dollar Bond Index Fund is suitable only for investors who:

- Are at least classified as aggressive based on their risk profile
- Have an investment horizon of more than five (5) years

KEY RISKS AND RISK MANAGEMENT

You should not invest in this Fund if you do not understand or are not comfortable with the accompanying risks.

Interest Rate Risk:

The fund invests in a portfolio of Philippine Sovereign and corporate securities comprising the JP Morgan Asia Credit Philippines Total Return Index, exposing investors to the risk of loss arising from a rise in interest rates, which generally causes fixed income security prices to decline. Factors/ events that may lead to a rise interest rates include adverse market conditions, issuer-specific factors/ events and/ or negative developments in domestic and global political and economic conditions.

Liquidity Risk:

Investors are exposed to the risk of loss due to the fund's inability to convert security holdings to cash immediately or in instances where conversion to cash is possible but at a highly disadvantageous price due to limited buyers/ sellers in the market, low trading volumes or market disruptions, among other reasons/



RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS*

The Fund has investments and trade transactions with BPI Asset Management and Trust Corporation (BPI AMTC):

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. The JP Morgan Asia Credit Index (JACI) Philippines fell 0.10% in January as Philippine dollar-denominated bond yields rose by an average of 7 basis points (bps) across the curve. Global bond yields rose in early January as general optimism over the coronavirus (COVID19) vaccine kept risk assets afloat. In the US, bonds were sold down following news of a Democratic party sweep—securing control over the Presidency, House and Senate—which raised expectations of further fiscal stimulus to boost the ailing economy. Over the month however, investor preference for safe havens returned amid concerns over the potential delays in vaccine roll-outs across the globe. US economic data continued to be mixed, with purchasing managers' indices pointing to expanding economic activity and construction starts rising in December, while the job market worsened slightly. For the month, the 10-year US Treasury benchmark yield rose 13 basis points to close at the 1.07% level.

In the local economic space, December inflation came in at 3.5% year-on-year, above expectations of 3.2% and bringing full-year 2020 average inflation to 2.6%. Food inflation continued to spike, driven by supply constraints due to the effects of inclement weather and the African Swine Flu. The Philippine full-year GDP figure also disappointed, with fourth-quarter year-on-year growth at -8.3%, bringing the full-year 2020 growth figure to an all-time low of -9.5%. Weak demand and capital formation were the main causes of the decline, as pandemic-related mobility constraints impeded spending and lowered demand expectations, causing companies to cut capital expenditures. The negative growth and high inflation figures, together with doubts about local vaccine acquisition and distribution capability, impaired local risk sentiment, driving investors into safer assets and pushing risk asset prices lower. With its policy rate at record lows and with the possibility of transitorily higher inflation, the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) is expected to remain accommodative but maintain current policy. In statements made throughout the month, BSP Governor Benjamin Diokno continued to emphasize the bank's focus on supporting growth using the full range of policy tools at its disposal.

Fund Performance. The fund returned 0.07% for the month, ahead of its benchmark index by 0.17%.

Fund Strategy. The Fund will continue to closely track the JPMorgan Asia Credit Total Return Index. Investors in a bond fund must be prepared to withstand volatility as higher investment value is typically achieved over the medium to long term.

The following are among the Fund's approved investment outlets, wherein the Trustee intends to invest depending on strategy, availability, or other market-driven circumstances:

- (a) Primarily long term tradable fixed-income instruments issued or guaranteed by the Philippine government or the BSP; tradable fixed-income instruments issued by financial institutions or private corporations; exchange-listed securities; marketable instruments that are traded in an organized exchange; loans traded in an organized market; and, such other tradable investment outlets/ categories as the BSP may allow.
- (b) Tradable fixed-income securities issued, underwritten, or otherwise dealt by BPI and/or any of its subsidiaries, affiliates, their successors-in-interest or assignees, their directors, officers, stockholders, and related interest, and any of their trust and fund managed accounts, under such terms and conditions as the Trustee may deem to be in the best interest of the Fund
- (c) The principal investments of the Fund will be in fixed-income instruments denominated in, but are not limited to, the following major currencies: U.S. Dollar, Euro, British Pound, Canadian Dollar, Australian Dollar, Swiss Franc, Danish Kroner, and Japanese Yen.
- (d) Bank deposits and such other investments allowed under regulations issued by the BSP.
