The Fund aims to generate liquidity and stable income by investing in a diversified portfolio of primarily short-term fixed income instruments. The Fund aims to provide excess return over the return of the 91-day Philippine Treasury Bill, net of tax.



OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. The BPI Money Market Index returned 0.16% in January as money market benchmark yields fell 7 basis points (bps) on average, with the greatest yield declines seen in the 12- and 6-month benchmark tenors.

The Bureau of the Treasury (BTr) sold four tranches of Treasury Bills (T-bills) over the month's course, with each tranche comprising PHP5-7bn of 91-day, PHP7bn of 182-day, and PHP10bn of 364-day securities. Demand for all tenors increased as the month progressed, and all auctions were fully awarded. Between the last auctions in this month and the previous month, yields for the 3- and 6-month securities fell 5-8 bps, while the yield of the 1-year security fell 14 bps. In the last auction of the month, the 91-, 182-, and 364-day securities were awarded at average yields of 0.969%, 1.323%, and 1.542%, respectively.

In the local economic space, December inflation came in at 3.5% year-on-year, above expectations of 3.2% and bringing fullyear 2020 average inflation to 2.6%. Food inflation continued to spike, driven by supply constraints due to the effects of inclement weather and the African Swine Flu. The Philippine full-year GDP figure also disappointed, with fourth-quarter year-onyear growth at -8.3%, bringing the full-year 2020 growth figure to an all-time low of -9.5%. Weak demand and capital formation were the main causes of the decline, as pandemic-related mobility constraints impeded spending and lowered demand expectations, causing companies to cut capital expenditures. The negative growth and high inflation figures, together with doubts about local vaccine acquisition and distribution capability, impaired local risk sentiment, driving investors into safer assets and pushing risk asset prices lower. With its policy rate at record lows and with the possibility of transitorily higher inflation, the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) is expected to remain accommodative but maintain current policy. In statements made throughout the month, BSP Governor Benjamin Diokno continued to emphasize the bank's focus on supporting growth using the full range of policy tools at its disposal.

Fund Performance. The Fund returned 0.04% during the month, behind benchmark by 0.04%.

Fund Strategy. The Fund favors the safety of Time Deposits. Expectations of monetary easing moving forward may depress short-term rates.

- (a) Tradable fixed-income instruments issued or guaranteed by the Philippine government or the BSP; tradable fixed-income instruments issued by financial institutions or private corporations; exchange-listed securities; marketable instruments that are traded in an organized exchange; loans traded in an organized market; and, such other tradable investment outlets/ categories as the BSP may allow.
- (b) Tradable fixed-income securities issued, underwritten, or otherwise dealt by BPI and/or any of its subsidiaries, affiliates, their successors-in-interest or assignees, their directors, officers, stockholders, and related interest, and any of their trust and fund managed accounts, under such terms and conditions as the Trustee may deem to be in the best interest of the Fund.
- (c) Collective investment vehicles managed by reputable fund managers the investment objectives and policies of which are generally consistent with those of the Fund, subject to then existing BSP regulations.
- (d) Bank deposits and such other investments allowed under regulations issued by the BSP.
