Given its focus on income, the Fund does not intend to outperform this benchmark.

Any investor who owns more than 10% shall be asked to redeem the amount (or its equivalent number of units) in excess of 10% within thirty (30) calendar days.

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. Global equities declined over the month as volatility remained elevated amid rising geopolitical tensions, accelerating inflation, and tighter monetary policy, offset by generally improving COVID-19 trends. Russia invaded Ukraine, initiating attacks on multiple cities, including the capital, Kyiv, in a move Russian President Vladimir Putin labelled a "special military operation", aiming for the "demilitarisation and denazification" of Ukraine. In response, US and NATO allies imposed severe economic sanctions on Russia, largely cutting off the Russian economy from global financial markets and limiting the ability of the Russian central bank to take counteractive measures. Prices for natural gas and select grains and metals surged, and Brent crude oil prices topped US\$100 per barrel amid expectations that sanctions would cripple energy exports and restrict the supplies of key commodities. These dynamics drove inflation expectations even higher, further complicating the efforts by global central banks to counteract surging inflation. COVID-19 cases dropped across most regions. Most global sovereign yields rose, driven by prospects of more aggressive central bank tightening amid higher inflation, although geopolitical concerns drove a partial reversal in select G10 yields at the end of the month. Most fixed income sectors underperformed amid broad credit spread widening, along with sovereign yield increases spurred by major central banks' tightening stance.

Fund Performance. The fund declined by 1.82% in February. Within global equities, from a regional perspective, negative performance was led by the United States as Russia's large-scale military attack on Ukraine and expectations of a more aggressive monetary policy tightening drove the S&P 500 index into correction territory. Within global fixed income, performance was negative across the credit sectors, led by losses from investment-grade, high-yield and emerging-market credit as spreads widened on top of rising yields.

Fund Strategy. In the near-term, we remain fairly cautious and maintain our equity risk management hedges, taking into account the risks of the ongoing Russia/ Ukraine conflict. We expect a risk premium in global equity and credit markets for elevated geopolitical uncertainty, and even more so in Europe and emerging markets. However, given the repricing that we have already seen and the likelihood of less hawkish developed market central banks, we expect global equities to still outperform global bonds over a 12-month horizon. On a regional basis, we prefer developed over emerging markets (EM) given China's slowdown and the hardships EM countries face post-pandemic, including slower growth, high inflation, worse fiscal deficits, and greater political volatility. Within fixed income, we are moderately bearish on government bonds as well as credit, as we think credit valuations are rich and most spreads may continue to be challenged. Finally, we believe this market environment to be supportive of security selection and active management. Against this back-drop, income investors will be best served through a highly diversified portfolio of multi-asset income producing assets that can be dynamically adjusted as market conditions evolve.

LIST OF PROSPECTIVE INVESTMENTS

The following are among the Fund's approved investment outlets, wherein the Trustee intends to invest depending on strategy, availability, or other marketdriven circumstances:

- a) Primarily in a single collective investment scheme whose investment objective is to provide investment results that maximize income; provided further that such CIS is approved or registered and supervised by a regulatory authority that is a member of the International Organization of Securities Commissions (IOSCO) and managed by reputable fund manager/s; provided further that the investment in the said collective investment scheme should at least be ninety percent (90%) of the total assets of the Fund. The target Fund must be recognized as a collective investment scheme in its home jurisdiction by a regulatory authority or any regulatory authority acceptable to the BSP to supervise the CIS.
- b) Primarily short-term tradable fixed-income instruments issued or guaranteed by the Philippine government or the BSP; tradable securities issued by the government of a foreign country, any political subdivision/agency of a foreign country or any supranational entity; tradable fixed- income instruments issued by foreign or local financial institutions or private corporations; exchange-listed securities; marketable instruments that are traded in an organized exchange; loans traded in an organized market; and, such other tradable investments outlets/ categories as the BSP may allow. Provided, that, a financial instrument is regarded as tradable if two-way prices are quoted, readily available or regularly available from an exchange, dealer, broker, industry group, pricing service or regulatory agency, and those prices represent actual and regularly occurring market transactions on an arm's length basis.
- c) Primarily short-term tradable fixed-income instruments issued, underwritten, or otherwise dealt by BPI and/or any of its subsidiaries, affiliates, their successors-in-interest or assignees, their directors, officers, stockholders, and related interest, and any of their trust and fund managed accounts, under such terms and conditions as the Trustee may deem to be in the best interest of the Fund; and, any such other instruments as may be allowed under BSP regulations. Investment with related interests shall be in accordance with Subsection X410.12 (a) of the Manual of Regulations for Banks.
- d) The principal investments of the Fund will be denominated in, but not limited to the US Dollar. The target fund invests in securities denominated in other currencies.
- e) Bank deposits or tradable debt instruments issued by the BSP.
- f) Such other investments allowed under regulations issued by the BSP.
