INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Fund, operating as a Feeder Fund, intends to achieve for its Participants stable income with a secondary focus on long term capital growth by investing in a Target Fund that invests in diversified portfolio of global equity and fixed income instruments. The Fund shall use 35% MSCI World Index (USD Hedged) + 5% MSCI Emerging Markets Index (Unhedged) + 25% Bloomberg Barclays Global Aggregate Corporate Index (USD Hedged) + 15% Bloomberg Barclays Global High Yield Index (USD Hedged) + 20% FTSE World Government Bond 10+ Years Index (USD Hedged) only as a reference benchmark. Given its focus on income, the Fund does not intend to outperform this benchmark.

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process should be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, before deciding to invest.

The BPI Invest US Dollar Income Feeder Fund is suitable only for investors who:



OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. Global equities rose over the month. Volatility remained elevated due to geopolitical risks, restrictive monetary policy and banking crisis that renewed recession concerns. The disruptions in the global banking system weighed on most fixed income sectors. Major central banks remained focused on bringing inflation under control despite the headwinds in the banking industry. Most global sovereign yields fell as concerns over the global banking system prompted investors to move to safety and an increase in dovish expectations of the Fed Funds rate. Global credit bonds underperformed comparable government bonds as spreads widened.

Fund Performance. The fund returned 1.06% for the month. Within global equities, from a regional perspective, gains were driven by US and Europe as both economies remained robust amid resilient macroeconomic data and swift action from policy makers to return stability into the markets following bank failures in the earlier part of the month. Within global fixed income, investment-grade and developed-market government bond helped performance as vields declined.

Fund Strategy. While our focus previously was on persistent elevated inflation and aggressively hawkish central banks, the economic outlook has shifted to weaker growth precipitated by a credit crunch in the US. This has pulled forward the potential for recession, with central banks continuing to manage inflation while simultaneously supporting the financial system. We have increased our underweight to equity in light of recent developments and slowing global growth. On a relative basis, we are more constructive on high quality fixed income which looks more competitive from a yield perspective, coupled with rising near-term recession risk and slowing inflationary pressures making duration look more attractive. In our base case for 2023, we expect inflation to decline but remain above target in 2023, allowing central banks to stop tightening but not to cut rates. We expect further deterioration in macro variables to weigh on earnings expectations and will need to see the earnings downgrade process play out before we turn more favourable on global equities. Within equities, we continue to focus on quality, preferring companies with pricing power, long-term margin stability and healthy balance sheets that can withstand inflationary pressures. Within fixed income, we have shifted from a neutral to modest overweight in government bonds, with preference for US rates over Europe and Japan. We think the Fed is ahead on the hiking cycle and could see a pause in rate hikes while the ECB has relatively more work to do to rein in inflation. Finally, we believe this market environment to be supportive of security selection and active management. Against this backdrop, income investors will be best served through a highly diversified portfolio of multi-asset income producing assets that can be dynamically adjusted as market conditions evolve.

LIST OF PROSPECTIVE INVESTMENTS

The following are among the Fund's approved investment outlets, wherein the Trustee intends to invest depending on strategy, availability, or other market-

- a) Primarily in a single collective investment scheme whose investment objective is to provide investment results that maximize income; provided further that such CIS is approved or registered and supervised by a regulatory authority that is a member of the International Organization of Securities Commissions (IOSCO) and managed by reputable fund manager/s; provided further that the investment in the said collective investment scheme should at least be ninety percent (90%) of the total assets of the Fund. The target Fund must be recognized as a collective investment scheme in its home jurisdiction by a regulatory authority or any regulatory authority acceptable to the BSP to supervise the CIS.
- b) Primarily short-term tradable fixed income instruments issued or guaranteed by the Philippine government or the BSP; tradable securities issued by the government of a foreign country, any political subdivision/agency of a foreign country or any supranational entity; tradable fixed-income instruments issued by foreign or local financial institutions or private corporations; exchange-listed securities; marketable instruments that are traded in an organized exchange; loans traded in an organized market; and, such other tradable investments outlets/ categories as the BSP may allow. Provided, that, a financial instrument is regarded as tradable if two-way prices are quoted, readily available or regularly available from an exchange, dealer, broker, industry group, pricing service or regulatory agency, and those prices represent actual and regularly occurring market transactions on an arm's length basis.
- c) Primarily short-term tradable fixed-income instruments issued, underwritten, or otherwise dealt by BPI and/or any of its subsidiaries, affiliates, their successors-in-interest or assignees, their directors, officers, stockholders, and related interest, and any of their trust and fund managed accounts, under such terms and conditions as the Trustee may deem to be in the best interest of the Fund; and, any such other instruments as may be allowed under BSP regulations. Investment with related interests shall be in accordance with Subsection X410.12 (a) of the Manual of Regulations for Banks.
- d) The principal investments of the Fund will be denominated in, but not limited to the US Dollar. The target fund invests in securities denominated in other currencies.
- e) Bank deposits or tradable debt instruments issued by the BSP.
- f) Such other investments allowed under regulations issued by the BSP.
