# **INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY**

The Fund, operating as a Feeder Fund, intends to achieve long term capital growth by investing in a Target Fund that invests in stocks in the health care sector. The Fund aims to provide excess return over the MSCI World Health Care Index. Pursuant to existing BSP rules and regulations, as a Feeder Fund, this Fund is mandated to invest at least 90% of its assets in a single collective investment scheme.

#### **CLIENT SUITABILITY**

A client profiling process shall be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, before deciding to invest.

The BPI Global Health Care Feeder Fund is for investors who:

• Are at least classified as aggressive based on their risk profile.

Participation in the Fund shall be open to Participants with legal capacity to contract and who are not considered US persons under the US securities and tax laws, subject to the other conditions, rules or provisions stated in the Plan Rules and those established by the Trustee. No beneficial owner shall hold more than 10% of the Fund. Any investor who owns more than 10% shall be asked to redeem the amount (or its equivalent number of units) in excess of 10% within thirty (30) calendar days.



#### OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. Global equity markets saw positive performance continue in February driven by resilient economic data and strong earnings reports, resulting in year-to-date gains. Emerging markets had a modest performance, returning 4.8% in February, while Japan's Nikkei 225 Index reached a new all-time high. Earnings season saw the mega-cap technology stocks meeting or exceeding expectations, resulting to a 5.3% gain in the S&P 500. Economic data remained robust in the US, with strong job additions and expanding business activity indicated in the Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI). European markets lagged broader equity markets driven by disappointing earnings reports from UK equities, with the MSCI Europe returning 2.0%. Japanese equities rose by 4.9% amid investor optimism on corporate reforms and Bank of Japan's policy pivot that are expected to benefit Japanese businesses. Chinese markets rebounded after government interventions and positive macroeconomic data, with the MSCI China Index gaining 8.6% in February. The MSCI World Health Care Index returned 2.3% over the period. Within the index, medical technology and large-cap biopharmaceuticals were the top performing sectors for the month.

**Fund Performance.** The fund returned 3.53% in February, outperforming the benchmark by 128 basis points. Strong security selection within biopharmaceuticals helped performance.

Fund Strategy. Supportive valuations, robust innovation pipeline and business models that are positioned to show resilience through the cycle should benefit the sector over the long-term. Within the biopharma industry, breakthrough innovations continue to provide attractive opportunities. In the US, the fund continues to monitor the next steps in IRA policy implementation, but valuations remain attractive and recent developments continue to support robust growth assumptions for major indications. Outside of biopharma, medical technology companies have numerous opportunities due to advancements in technology development, engineering capabilities, and integrated informatics. Recent volatility and disruption across the subsector have created new investment opportunities, particularly across many SMID cap companies and life science tools companies, where valuations look attractive. Within health care services, the fund favors companies focused on improving patient outcomes while reigning in costs. The fund will continue to favor companies that develop innovative products designed to address important unmet medical needs. Over the long term, the tailwinds of innovation and an aging population should continue to drive growth for the sector.

## LIST OF PROSPECTIVE INVESTMENTS

The following are among the Fund's approved investment outlets, wherein the Trustee intends to invest depending on strategy, availability, or other market-driven circumstances:

- (a) Primarily in a single collective investment scheme whose investment objective is to provide investment results in excess of the return of the MSCI World Health Care Index; provided further that such CIS is approved or registered and supervised by a regulatory authority that is a member of the International Organization of Securities Commissions (IOSCO) and managed by reputable fund manager/s; provided further that the investment in the said collective investment scheme should at least be ninety percent (90%) of the total assets of the Fund. The Target Fund must be recognized as a collective investment scheme in its home jurisdiction by a regulatory authority or any regulatory authority acceptable to the BSP to supervise this CIS.
- (b) Short-term tradable fixed-income instruments issued or guaranteed by the Philippine government or the BSP; tradable securities issued by the government of a foreign country, any political subdivision/agency of a foreign country or any supranational entity; tradable fixed-income instruments issued by foreign or local financial institutions or private corporations; exchange- listed securities; marketable instruments that are traded in an organized exchange; loans traded in an organized market; and, such other tradable investments outlets/ categories as the BSP may allow. Provided, that, a financial instrument is regarded as tradable if two-way prices are quoted, readily available or regularly available from an exchange, dealer, broker, industry group, pricing service or regulatory agency, and those prices represent actual and regularly occurring market transactions on an arm's length basis.
- (c) Short-term tradable fixed-income instruments issued, underwritten, or otherwise dealt by BPI and/or any of its subsidiaries, affiliates, their successors-in-interest or assignees, their directors, officers, stockholders, and related interest, and any of their trust and fund managed accounts, under such terms and conditions as the Trustee may deem to be in the best interest of the Fund; and, any such other instruments as may be allowed under BSP regulations. Investment with related interests shall be in accordance with Section 414-Q of the Manual of Regulations for Non-Bank Financial Institutions.
- (d) The principal investments of the Fund will be denominated in, but not limited to the U.S. Dollar. The target fund invests in securities denominated in other currencies.
- (e) Bank deposits or tradable debt instruments issued by the BSP
- (f) Such other investments allowed under regulations issued by the BSP.

# **INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE OF TARGET FUND**

The Wellington Global Health Care Equity Fund seeks long-term total returns. The Investment Manager will actively manage the Fund, seeking to achieve the objective by investing in the equity securities of health care companies worldwide. The Fund takes a long term value approach and seeks to invest in fundamentally sound companies. Although the Fund is not constructed relative to a benchmark, the MSCI World Health Care index will serve as a reference benchmark.
