INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Fund aims to achieve liquidity and stable income derived from a diversified portfolio of primarily short-term fixed income instruments. The Fund aims to provide excess return over the return of the 91-day Philippine Treasury Bill, net of tax.

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process shall be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust / Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, before deciding to invest.

Interest Rate Risk:	The fund invests in short term domestic fixed income securities, exposing investors to the risk of loss arising from a rise in interest rates, which generally causes fixed income security prices to decline. Factors/events that may lead to a rise in interest rates include adverse market conditions, issuer-specific factors/events and/or negative developments in domestic political and economic conditions.
Liquidity	Investors are exposed to the risk of loss due to the Fund's inability to convert security holdings to cash immediately or in instances where conversion to cash is possible but at a highly disadvantageous price due to limited buyers.



OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. April 2025 was a stable month for the Philippine local fixed income market, characterized by mixed movements in yields and strong investor demand for government securities. The market navigated through global economic uncertainties and local fiscal policies effectively. The BPI Philippine Government Bond Index returned 0.30% for the month as rates crept higher by 3 bps on average, mostly on the long end of the curve. Both domestic and international factors, including central bank policies, inflation trends, and geopolitical developments affected yield movements for the period. The Bureau of Treasury (BTr) initially announced 4 FXTN auctions for the month. The first two were re-issuances of 5-year FXTN 7-70 and 7-year FXTN20-17, both fully awarded at average rates of 5.908% and 5.986%, respectively. The 15-year auction scheduled in the last week of April was cancelled to accommodate for the jumbo 10-year FXTN issuance. The government raised a total of PHP 300 billion of FXTN 10-73 with the coupon rate set at 6.375%. Demand for government securities remained strong, particularly for medium-term bonds. On the other hand, short-term rates saw an increase due to position trimming to fund the settlement of new 10-year paper. Local inflation slowed further to 1.8% in March 2025, down from 2.1% in February. This easing inflation supported stable bond prices. The Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) eased its policy rate by 25 basis points bringing the benchmark rate to 5.50%. Moreover, the BSP reduced its risk-adjusted inflation forecast to 2.3% (from 3.5%) for 2025 and 3.3% for 2026.

Fund Performance. The Fund returned 0.34% during the month, underperforming the benchmark by a basis point.

Fund Strategy. The Fund favors the safety of shorter-dated securities and time deposits. Expectations of interest rates staying elevated may help maintain current portfolio yield.

LIST OF PROSPECTIVE INVESTMENTS

The following are among the Fund's approved investment outlets, wherein the Trustee intends to invest depending on strategy, availability, or other market-driven circumstances:

- a) Tradable fixed-income instruments issued or guaranteed by the Philippine government or the BSP; tradable fixed-income instruments issued by financial institutions or private Corps; exchange-listed securities; marketable instruments that are traded in an organized exchange; loans traded in an organized market; and such other tradable investment outlets/ categories as the BSP may allow.
- b) Tradable fixed-income securities issued, underwritten, or otherwise dealt by BPI and/or any of its subsidiaries, affiliates, their successors-in-interest or assignees, their directors, officers, stockholders, and related interest, and any of their trust and fund managed accounts, under such terms and conditions as the Trustee may deem to be in the best interest of the Fund.
- c) Collective investment vehicles managed by reputable fund managers the investment objectives and policies of which are generally consistent with those of the Fund, subject to then existing BSP regulations.
- d) Bank deposits and such other investments allowed under regulations issued by the BSP.

The Fund may invest in allowed Bangko Sentral Securities Facilities (BSP-SF) as one of its approved investment outlets. Pursuant to Section 601-Q of the Manual of Regulations for Non-Bank Financial Institutions, as amended, participations to UITFs with exposure to BSP-SF shall be limited to <u>Philippine individual and corporate</u> residents only.

Where it is deemed that the identified non-Philippine resident participants' investments violate applicable regulations, BPI Wealth shall immediately redeem the investment.
