INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Fund, operating as a Fund-of-Funds, seeks to achieve long-term capital growth by investing in a diversified portfolio of global equity and fixed income collective investment schemes which integrate environmental, social, and governance in its process, investment criteria the of incorporation including sustainability goals and facilitation of flow of funds towards green economic activities, climate change mitigation and projects, and other adaptation positive environmental and social impact initiatives.

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process shall be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, before deciding to invest.

The BPI Sustainable Global Balanced Fund-of-Funds is for investors who:

- Are at least classified as aggressive based on their risk profile.
- Have an investment horizon of at least five (5) years.

Participation in the Fund shall be open to Participants with legal capacity to contract and who are not considered US persons under the US securities and tax laws, subject to the other conditions, rules or provisions stated in the Plan Rules and those established by the Trustee. No beneficial owner shall hold more than 10% of the Fund. Any investor who owns more than 10% shall be asked to redeem the amount (or its equivalent number of units) in excess of 10% within thirty (30) calendar days.

Market/Price Risk:

Investors are exposed to adverse changes in the prices of foreign currency denominated fixed income instruments of the target funds due to a rise in interest rates as a result of adverse market conditions, unfavorable developments in the political and economic conditions of countries where the underlying securities of the target funds are issued or traded, or other issuer-specific factors.

Liquidity Risk:

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. In August, U.S. Treasury yields moved lower across most maturities, reflecting growing expectations of interest rate cuts by the Federal Reserve. The 2-year yield saw the largest decline, dropping 35 basis points from 3.94% to 3.59%. The 10-year yield also fell, moving from 4.37% to 4.23%. Interestingly, the 30-year yield bucked the trend, rising slightly by 3 basis points to 4.92%. These shifts were largely influenced by Fed Chair Jerome Powell's more dovish tone during his speech at the Jackson Hole symposium, which signaled a potential easing of monetary policy ahead. On the US economic front, the U.S. added 78,000 jobs in July, below market expectations of 100,000, suggesting a cooling labor market. Meanwhile, inflation held steady at 2.7%, unchanged from the previous month.

Globally, long-term government bond yields moved higher in August as investor demand weakened, largely due to rising concerns over high levels of sovereign debt and fiscal sustainability. This shift was evident across major markets, with 30-year German bund yields reaching 3.31%—their highest level since 2011. Similarly, 30-year UK Gilts rose to 5.6%, a level not seen since 1998, while 30-year French OATs climbed to 4.45%, marking a 14-year high.

In the Philippines, dollar-denominated bond yields fell across the curve, with shorter tenors seeing the most notable drop. The JP Morgan Asia Credit Index – Philippines delivered a monthly return of 1.33%, primarily driven by price appreciation

Global equities continued to climb, with the MSCI All Country World Equity Index up by 2.36% MoM. In August, sentiment was initially dampened by further developments in US trade negotiations, including the imposition of a 25% additional tariff on India, 35% tariffs on Canadian goods, and new reciprocal tariff rates on several countries. However, markets rebounded as dovish remarks from Fed officials, including Chair Powell's signal of a potential September rate cut, lifted investor sentiment. Stocks were further supported by above-consensus 2Q25 corporate earnings results and a softer-than-expected July US CPI inflation print of 2.7% YoY.

European and Asian markets continued to outperform in August, buoyed by monetary easing, resilient corporate earnings, and sector-specific tailwinds. The Euro Stoxx 50 rose 2.9% in USD terms supported by gains in energy and consumer discretionary sectors, particularly automotive stocks which benefited from a late-July tariff agreement with the U.S. Meanwhile, defense-related names declined slightly amid progress in security talks around Ukraine.

Japan's Nikkei 225 surged 4.0%, reaching a new all-time high mid-month. The rally was driven by a weaker yen, a favorable U.S.-Japan trade deal, and strong earnings in technology and manufacturing, especially in semiconductors and Al-linked sectors.

The August data highlights a global rotation toward markets benefiting from monetary stimulus and sectoral momentum, particularly in defense, infrastructure, and technology. As inflation pressures ease in parts of Europe and Asia and central banks signal dovish intentions, investor appetite for non-U.S. equities continues to grow. This reflects a shifting macroeconomic landscape, where policy support and sectoral strength are driving performance outside the U.S.

Fund Performance. The fund returned 0.45%, lagging the benchmark by 152 basis points. Security selection within the fund detracted performance.

Fund Strategy. We expect major structural trends in sustainability, such as increasing market share of electric vehicles and record installation of wind turbines and solar panels, to continue. The ongoing Russia-Ukraine war has resulted in the world, particularly Europe, determined to reduce their reliance on traditional sources of energy such as oil in gas, requiring large investments in renewable energy in the coming years. In addition, we continue to see support for green technologies through government policies across the globe. We believe that strong ESG companies are likely to generate positive financial performance over time as investing in sustainability can deliver higher growth and returns through innovation, higher operational efficiency and better risk management.

The Target Fund must be recognized as a collective investment scheme in its home jurisdiction by a regulatory authority or any regulatory authority acceptable to the BSP to supervise this CIS.
