INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Fund, operating as a Feeder Fund, aims to achieve stable income with a secondary focus on long term capital growth by investing in a Target Fund that invests in diversified portfolio of global equity and fixed income instruments. The Fund shall use 35% MSCI World Index (USD Hedged) + 5% MSCI Emerging Markets Index (Unhedged) + 25% Bloomberg Barclays Global Aggregate Corporate Index (USD Hedged) + 15% Bloomberg Barclays Global High Yield Index (USD Hedged) + 20% FTSE World Government Bond 10+ Years Index (USD Hedged) only as a reference benchmark. Given its focus on income, the Fund does not intend to outperform this benchmark.

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process should be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, before deciding to invest.

The BPI US Dollar Income Feeder Fund is suitable only for investors who:

- Are classified as aggressive based on their risk profile.
- Seek regular income with a secondary focus on capital appreciation over the medium to long term.
- Are comfortable with the risks of a global multi-asset fund.

Participation in the Fund shall be open to Participants with legal capacity to contract and who are not considered US persons under the US securities and tax laws, subject to the other conditions, rules or provisions stated in the Plan Rules and those established by the Trustee. No beneficial owner shall hold more than 10% of the Fund. Any investor who owns more than 10% shall be asked to redeem the amount (or its equivalent number of units) in excess of 10% within thirty (30) calendar days.



OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. Global equities experienced a slight decline in February 2025, with the MSCI World Index down by 0.72%. The month was marked by profit-taking in large-cap US technology stocks and a shift towards value stocks amid economic uncertainties.

US equities struggled due to concerns over stretched valuations in mega-cap tech stocks and signs of weakening consumer demand. Retail sales declined by 0.8%, and consumer confidence softened, reinforcing investor caution. The US Federal Reserve maintained its focus on promoting maximum employment and stable prices. US inflation moderated but remained slightly above the 2% target, prompting the Fed to re-emphasize its commitment to using all available tools to support economic stability. Meanwhile, European equities outperformed as UK stocks reached record highs. Optimism was driven by the likelihood of a ceasefire in Ukraine and strong earnings in the defense and financial sectors. In Asia, Japanese equities showed resilience amid a mix of macroeconomic and geopolitical factors. The Tokyo Stock Price Index (TOPIX) saw a modest gain, driven by strong performances in the technology and consumer sectors. The Bank of Japan's decision to raise its unsecured overnight call rate to 0.5%, the highest in 17 years, was a significant move towards monetary policy normalization. This rate hike, along with positive earnings reports from major companies, bolstered investor confidence.

Fund Performance. The fund gained by 0.41% in February. Within global equities, the US and Europe were key contributors to performance. US equities continued to benefit from optimism about President Donald Trump's proposed policy initiatives for tax cuts and deregulation while European equities rose on the back of the eurozone economy expanding in 2024. All sectors generated positive returns over the month, led by financials and real estate. Within global fixed income, emerging market debt and investment grade credit delivered gains as spreads compressed. Lastly, active asset allocation was flat as gains from our long US equity position were offset by our short UK equity position.

Fund Strategy. Looking ahead, a soft landing remains as our base case but we expect recent volatility to continue into the year. We are modestly overweight to equities as we anticipate that the overall supportive economic growth environment, combined with a robust earnings outlook, will result in positive relative returns from equity markets this year. However, the bar for outperformance will be higher and valuations at the aggregate level are elevated, warranting a modest position sizing. Our position on overall duration remains neutral. We are looking for a better entry point, given current levels are not providing a compelling excess return relative to volatility. We maintain an underweight position in US rates due to expectations of stable growth, a strong labor market, and more persistent inflation in the coming months. The uncertainty surrounding Trump's policies adds to concerns about potential upside risks to US rates, reinforcing our underweight position. Additionally, we maintain a neutral stance on investment grade and high yield credit, expecting spreads to stay range-bound in 2025 with no clear catalyst for widening from current tight levels. During this volatile period, we have focused on risk management to help mitigate downside risks. Against this backdrop, income investors will be best served through a highly diversified portfolio of multi-asset income producing assets that can be dynamically adjusted as market conditions evolve.

LIST OF PROSPECTIVE INVESTMENTS

The following are among the Fund's approved investment outlets, wherein the Trustee intends to invest depending on strategy, availability, or other market-driven circumstances:

- (a) Primarily in a single collective investment scheme whose investment objective is to provide investment results that maximize income; provided further that such CIS is approved or registered and supervised by a regulatory authority that is a member of the International Organization of Securities Commissions (IOSCO) and managed by reputable fund manager/s; provided further that the investment in the said collective investment scheme should at least be ninety percent (90%) of the total assets of the Fund. The target Fund must be recognized as a collective investment scheme in its home jurisdiction by a regulatory authority or any regulatory authority acceptable to the BSP to supervise the CIS.
- (b) Primarily short-term tradable fixed-income instruments issued or guaranteed by the Philippine government or the BSP; tradable securities issued by the government of a foreign country, any political subdivision/agency of a foreign country or any supranational entity; tradable fixed- income instruments issued by foreign or local financial institutions or private corporations; exchange-listed securities; marketable instruments that are traded in an organized exchange; loans traded in an organized market; and, such other tradable investments outlets/ categories as the BSP may allow. Provided, that, a financial instrument is regarded as tradable if two-way prices are quoted, readily available or regularly available from an exchange, dealer, broker, industry group, pricing service or regulatory agency, and those prices represent actual and regularly occurring market transactions on an arm's length basis.
- (c) Primarily short-term tradable fixed-income instruments issued, underwritten, or otherwise dealt by BPI and/or any of its subsidiaries, affiliates, their successors-in-interest or assignees, their directors, officers, stockholders, and related interest, and any of their trust and fund managed accounts, under such terms and conditions as the Trustee may deem to be in the best interest of the Fund; and, any such other instruments as may be allowed under BSP regulations. Investment with related interests shall be in accordance with Subsection X410.12 (a) of the Manual of Regulations for Banks.
- (d) The principal investments of the Fund will be denominated in, but not limited to the US Dollar. The target fund invests in securities denominated in other currencies.
- (e) Bank deposits or tradable debt instruments issued by the BSP.

(f) Such other investments allowed under regulations issued by the BSP
