INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND SUMMARY

The Fund aims to achieve long- term capital and income growth by investing in a diversified portfolio of fixed income and equity securities. The Fund aims to outperform its benchmark which is composed of 50% BPI Philippine Government Bond Index and 50% PSEi Total Return Index (PSEi TRI).

KEY RISKS AND RISK MANAGEMENT

Interest Rate Risk: Investors are exposed to adverse changes in the prices of domestic fixed income securities due to a rise in interest rates, which generally causes fixed income security prices to decline. Factors/events that may lead to a rise in interest rates include adverse market conditions, issuer-specific factors/events and/or negative developments in domestic political and economic conditions.

Equity Price Risk: Investors are exposed to adverse changes in the prices of stocks listed in the Philippine Stock Exchange, which may be brought about by adverse stock market conditions, unfavorable company earnings and valuations and/ or negative developments in domestic and global political and economic conditions.

Liquidity Risk: Investors are exposed to the risk of loss due to the fund's inability to convert fixed income and equity security holdings to cash immediately or in instances where conversion to cash is possible but at a highly disadvantageous price due to limited buyers/ sellers in the market, low trading volumes or market disruptions, among other reasons/ factors.

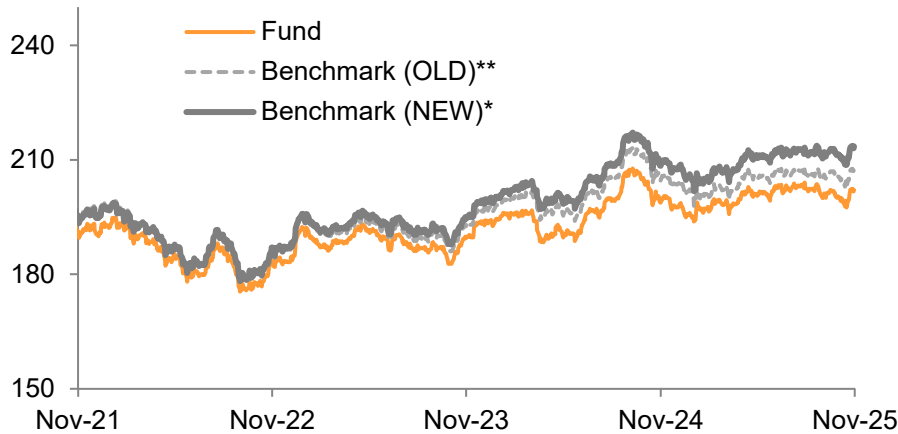

Name	Description and Key Characteristics
PSEi Total Return Index (PSEi TRI)	The Philippine Stock Exchange Index or PSEi is the main index of the Philippine Stock Exchange. The PSEi is a free float-adjusted market capitalization-weighted index of the 30 largest and most active common stock. The PSEi Total Return Index (PSEi TRI) covers both price performance and income from dividend payments by reinvesting cash dividends back to the PSEi according to each constituent's respective market capitalization weightings.
BPI Philippine Government Bond Index	The BPI Philippine Government Bond Index (the BPI Index) is sponsored by the Bank of the Philippine Islands (the Sponsor). The Sponsor is responsible for the design of the BPI Index and the issuance of these Rules. The BPI Index is intended to reflect the performance of Philippine Government, fixed-rate straight bonds denominated in Philippine Peso. It is intended to be a template for passive, diversified fixed income investment portfolios where securities are held in proportion to the market value (Market Capitalization) of the issued securities. It aims to provide accurate and objective benchmarks by which to assess the performance of the Philippine Government bond market. The BPI Index comprises of the BPI Philippine Government Bond Index as the primary index and five other indices, each with constituents covering more specific asset segments.

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. In November, local bond yields saw a month-on-month decline of 9.27 bps across the curve. Short-term yields (1 year and below) declined by an average of -3.48 basis points. The decline was most notable in the intermediate part of the curve as investors look to lengthen duration. The two and three-year declined the most by 18bps and 17 bps, respectively followed by the five-year with a 14 bps decline. The long-end also declined to the tune of 4 bps with growth prospects at risk. The BPI Money Market Index went up by 0.38%, BPI 1-5 Index up by 0.69%, and the BPI GS Overall Index up by 0.73%. October inflation came out at 1.7%, still below the government's 2 to 4 percent target range for the year. 3Q 2025 GDP also came out anemic at a print of 4%, lower than the 2Q print of 5.5%. The BSP surprised the market with a rate cut on October, moving ahead of potential economic slowdown amidst governance concern that dampened business sentiment. The dovish tone caused markets to price in further rate cuts going into December and 2026. Rates now stand at 4.75% after the cut. Market is expecting policy rate may reach 4% in 2026. The Philippine Stock Exchange Index (PSEi) had a choppy month in November before ultimately settling higher. The local bourse almost fell to a cliff, reaching sub-5,600, following a slew of weak domestic economic data such as dismal 3Q GDP, uninspiring 3Q corporate earnings coupled with heightened political issues. Concerns over Federal Reserve Policy Rates due to prolonged US Government Shutdown likewise dragged investor sentiment. However, the market was lifted by local bargain-hunting towards the latter part of the month. The PSEi rose by 1.56% month-on-month to close at 6,022.24. Trading activity surged in November with Average Daily Turnover registering at Php6.22 billion from Php5.00 billion following some key corporate action events such as the Maynilad (MYNLD) IPO and AREIT Secondary Share Placement. On foreign activity, foreigners turned "Net Buyers" at US\$78 million. On a per stock basis, the top three index gainers for the month include: CNVRG (+22.26%), SMC (+21.77%) and PLUS (+16.95%). Meanwhile, the bottom three performers were: URC (-13.70%), JFC (-12.74%) and SCC (-11.95%).

Fund Performance. The Fund returned 1.21% in November, lower than the benchmark by 9 basis points. Year-to-date, the Fund registered a gain of 0.58%, below the benchmark by 16 basis points.

Fund Strategy. The Fund looks to gradually increase its duration position as interest rates are expected to fall over the next few months. Local inflation has settled within the BSP's target in the past months and is expected to be manageable. After easing its policy rates by a total of 50 basis points in the first half of 2025, the BSP remains vigilant in monitoring inflation figures before considering further rate cuts. Volatility may persist in the near term driven by global factors, and the portfolio will be actively managed to take advantage of this. Investors in the bond fund must be prepared to withstand volatility as higher investment value is typically achieved over the medium - to - long term horizon. As for Equities, the Fund will remain defensive amidst volatility continues from uncertainties on Fed Rate Direction, Trump tariffs, geopolitics, and heightened local political risks. The Fund's preference is for companies with leading market capitalization, good fundamentals, dividend-paying and high-yielding.

- f) Shares offered in an Initial Public Offering (IPO), provided that the company will be listed on the Philippine Stock Exchange within the normal listing period (approximately 30 days from the start of the offer period);
- g) Exchange-listed securities;
- h) Marketable instruments that are traded in an organized exchange;
- i) Loans traded in an organized market; and
- j) Such other investments suitable to the nature, classification, and strategy of the Fund, as allowed by prevailing regulations.
