The Fund aims to achieve long- term capital and income growth by investing in a diversified portfolio of fixed income and equity securities. The Fund aims to outperform its benchmark which is composed of 70% BPI Philippine Government Bond Index and 30% Philippine Stock Exchange Total Return Index (PSEi TRI).

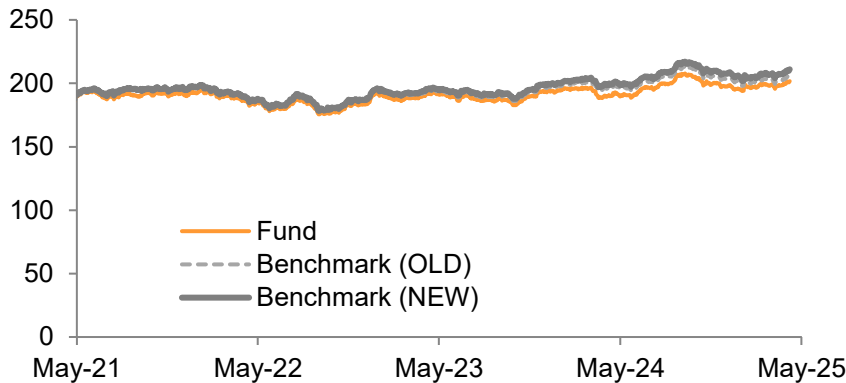

BENCHMARK INFORMATION

Name: The PSEi Total Return Index (PSEi TRI)

Date of Change: January 2, 2025

Description and Reason for Change: The Philippine Stock Exchange Index or PSEi is the main index of the Philippine Stock Exchange. The PSEi is a free float-adjusted market capitalization-weighted index of the 30 largest and most active common stock. The PSEi Total Return Index (PSEi TRI) covers both price performance and income from dividend payments by reinvesting cash dividends back to the PSEi according to each constituent's respective market capitalization weightings. The change in the fund's benchmark from PSEi to PSEi TRI is mainly to satisfy the characteristics of a valid benchmark for a UITF in the BSP Circular No. 1178, and to conform with the Global Investment Performance Standards (GIPS) requirement for firms to select an appropriate total return benchmark when available.

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. May 2025 saw a stable demand for Philippine local fixed income bonds. There was a steepening of the yield curve characterized by a quicker decline in the yields for the 1-5 year papers while the long-end remained high. As such, the BPI Philippine Government Bond Index returned 0.298% month-on-month, while the BPI Philippine Government Bond 1-5 Year Index returned higher at 0.457%. Demand for the short-end Tbill and the 1-5 year can be attributed to the declining CPI where actual print for the month of April, released in May, came out at 1.4% – lower than market expectations of 1.8%. This fueled the positive expectations that the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) has room to cut policy rates at the next meeting in June with Governor Remolona stating two rate cuts are still on the table for the year. The long-end of the curve remained elevated as The Bureau of Treasury (BTr) chose to award the target issuance size of 25B fully for the 20-year FXTN auction last May 15. The highest awarded bid was at 6.618%. We continue to expect demand for local government securities to remain strong especially for the short to medium-term bonds. The BSP's current benchmark rate is at 5.5%. The market is currently pricing in a rate cut at the upcoming June 19 meeting as the BSP projected inflation to settle within the 0.9% to 1.7% in May – as significant decline compared to the inflation print the same time last year. Rate cuts will also be supportive of local growth amidst fear of growth slowdown caused by uncertainties in US tariff policy.

The Philippine Stock Exchange Index (PSEi) snapped its three month winning streak as the index slipped by 0.2% to 6,341.53. The local bourse surged early on as global developments particularly on the ever-pressing US Tariff issues continued to move markets. US and China struck a temporary trade deal that covered a 90-day pause on tariffs and a decline in reciprocal tariffs by 115 percentage points. Moreover, US President Donald Trump postponed the 50% tariffs implementation on European Union imports. On the local scene, sentiment was supported by the strong Philippine peso after trading below the Php56 level. However, gains were capped at the latter part of the month on the back of slower-than-expected 1Q GDP for the Philippines at 5.4% compared to median estimate of 5.8%. The index was dragged even further following the MSCI rebalancing at month-end. On trading activity, the PSEi recorded an Average Daily Turnover of Php6.35 billion or 9% higher on a month-on-month basis. In terms of foreign activity, foreigners remained net sellers at US\$259 million dragged by a US\$283 million block sale of RRHI shares. Excluding the transaction, foreigners would have been net buyers. On a per stock basis, the top three index gainers for the month include: AGI (+36.27%), BLOOM (+22.58%) and ICT (+20.52%). Meanwhile, the bottom three performers were: CBC (-16.92%), GLO (-8.81%) and ALI (-8.18%).

Fund Performance. The Fund registered a gain of -0.23% in May, below the benchmark by 55 basis points. Year-to-date, the Fund registered a gain of 1.52%, above the benchmark by 11 basis points.

Fund Strategy. The Fund looks to gradually increase its duration position as interest rates are expected to fall over the next few months. Local inflation has settled within the BSP's target in the past months and is expected to be manageable. After easing its policy rates by 75 basis points in 2024, the BSP remains vigilant in monitoring inflation figures before easing rates further. Volatility may persist in the near term driven by global factors, and the portfolio will be actively managed to take advantage of this. Investors in the bond fund must be prepared to withstand volatility as higher investment value is typically achieved over the medium - to - long term horizon. As for Equities, the Fund will be opportunistic on market dips as volatility from the global front remains given lingering uncertainties on US tariffs and escalating geopolitical tensions. The preference is for companies with leading market capitalization, good fundamentals and are high-dividend paying.

The following are among the Fund's approved investment outlets, wherein the Trustee intends to invest depending on strategy, availability, or other market-driven circumstances:

- (a) Bank deposits and such other investments allowed under regulations issued by the BSP;
- (b) Securities issued by or guaranteed by the Philippine government, or by the BSP;
- (c) Tradable securities issued or guaranteed by multilateral institutions such as the Asian Development Bank (ADB), International Monetary Fund (IMF) and World Bank;
- (d) Tradable securities issued by the government of a foreign country, any political subdivision of a foreign country or any supranational entity;
- (e) Exchange-listed securities;
- (f) Marketable instruments that are traded in an organized exchange;
- (g) Loans traded in an organized market; and
- (h) Such other tradable investments outlets/categories as may be approved by the relevant authority and allowed by the BSP.
