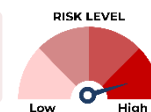

INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND SUMMARY

The Fund, operating as a Feeder Fund, aims to achieve long-term capital appreciation by investing in a Target Fund with a diversified portfolio of attractively-priced stocks with high dividend yields in the Asia Pacific region. The Fund aims to outperform its benchmark which is the MSCI AC Asia Pacific ex-Japan High Dividend Net Return USD Index.

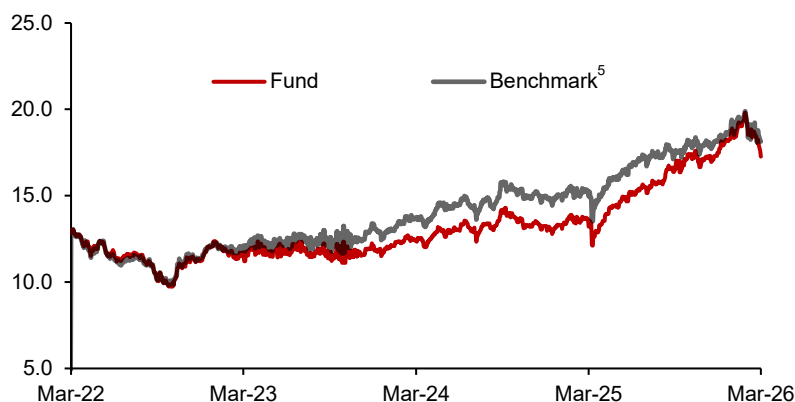

Name: MSCI AC Asia Pacific ex-Japan Net Total Return USD Index

Description and Key Characteristics: The MSCI AC Asia Pacific ex Japan Index captures large and mid cap representation across 4 of 5 Developed Market countries (excluding Japan) and 8 Emerging Market countries in the Asia Pacific region. With 1,192 constituents, the index covers approximately 85% of the free float-adjusted market capitalization in each country.

The index is based on the MSCI Global Investable Market Indexes (GIMI) Methodology —a comprehensive and consistent approach to index construction that allows for meaningful global views and cross regional comparisons across all market capitalization size, sector and style segments and combinations. This methodology aims to provide exhaustive coverage of the relevant investment opportunity set with a strong emphasis on index liquidity, investability and replicability.

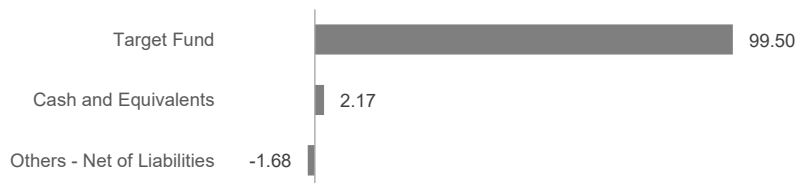
The MSCI Total Return Indices measure the market performance, including price performance and income from regular cash distributions (cash dividend payments or capital repayments). MSCI's Daily Total Return (DTR) methodology reinvests regular cash distributions in indices on the ex-date of such distributions.

Relation to the Fund's Objective or Investment Strategy: The Fund operates as a Feeder Fund. The Target Fund is actively managed and will refer to the benchmark when constructing the portfolio and managing its risk to ensure that the Fund remains aligned with its investment objectives. When selecting investments, the Target Trustee has discretion and is not restricted to the components or weighting of the Index. The Target Fund may invest in securities not included in the Index to take advantage of investment opportunities, subject to the asset class, regional, industry, sector and/or strategy requirements of its investment objectives. Investors may use the Index to measure the performance of the Fund.

PORTFOLIO COMPOSITION

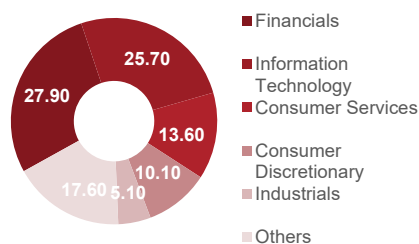
ALLOCATION (%)



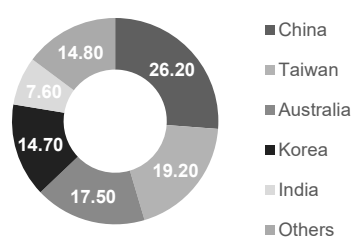

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. MSCI AC Asia Pacific ex Japan declined over the month. Escalating U.S. and Israeli military actions against Iran (which began in late February) drove a sharp rise in energy prices through March. This impacted Asian equities through (i) higher risk aversion—pressuring higher-beta and crowded positions, (ii) a shift in relative performance between energy producers and energy importers, and (iii) renewed inflation concerns that influenced interest-rate expectations. Korea underperformed amid profit-taking and renewed debate around memory pricing. Indonesia was weighed down by limited free float, a weak currency, governance concerns and foreign outflows. Malaysia proved comparatively resilient. The fund significantly outperformed its benchmark in March. Stock selection and an overweight allocation to Australia supported returns. Key contributors included Telstra, Santos and Coles Group. Telstra, the telecom operator, was the largest contributor following strong interim results and a higher interim dividend. Santos's share price rose early in the month as the ongoing conflict in the Middle East pushed crude oil prices higher and we continue to view it as an attractive upstream exposure. Coles Group gained as investors favoured defensive stocks during a volatile month. An underweight allocation to information technology also supported returns. Overweight exposure to Accton Technology and underweight exposure to SK Hynix benefited performance: Accton's shares rose on heightened demand for networking equipment used in AI data centres, while SK Hynix declined as investors reduced risk in South Korea amid uncertainty around oil prices. Stock selection in the consumer discretionary sector offset some gains elsewhere. Holdings in Kia and Shenzhou International, and the fund's lack of exposure to BYD, acted as a headwind. The conflict in the Middle East contributed to a sharp sell-off in South Korean equities, which weighed on Kia. Shenzhou International faced downward pressure due to weak earnings and revenue growth, declining profit margins and softer demand in China. BYD's share price rose after reporting strong overseas sales; we do not hold the stock due to its lack of yield. Other detractors during the month included Samsung C&T and SK Inc, which fell in line with the broader Korean market. In terms of portfolio activity, we focused on (i) adding to select positions where we continue to have high conviction and see attractive expected returns despite short-term volatility, (ii) selectively increasing exposure to upstream/energy where the risk-reward remains compelling, (iii) taking profits in names that have performed strongly but where risks have increased, and (iv) exiting positions where our thesis has weakened. We also reduced portfolio risk in Indonesia, narrowed our underweight in Materials, and added selectively to China staples and industrials. In India, we adjusted auto exposure with a preference for commercial vehicles, and we made targeted changes within Australian financials toward banks with a stronger outlook. We also initiated exposure in Indian financials linked to the asset management segment.

Fund Performance. The fund returned -12.20% in March, outperforming the benchmark by 105 basis points. Stock selection and allocation in Australia and the Technology sector helped the most.

Fund Strategy. A weaker dollar typically eases global financial conditions, enabling central banks to lower rates and supporting equity returns through portfolio inflows and USD-translated gains. Despite ongoing geopolitical uncertainty, substantial fiscal support and accommodative monetary policy across the U.S., Europe, and China should keep capital inexpensive and sustain global demand and investment throughout 2026. North Asia remains central to global manufacturing and the AI supply chain—including compute, testing and packaging, substrates, and cooling solutions—with 75% of global semiconductor manufacturing located in Asia. Surging technology exports and AI supply chain strength are driving a broader Asian export recovery, supported by data centre buildouts across ASEAN and the GCC. We favour memory producers alongside complementary choke points in packaging, testing, and substrates. However, valuation discipline is essential as we monitor for over-ordering in the data centre supply chain and potential air pockets in end-market demand. China is a two-speed market. Deflationary pressures driven by chronic over-investment and the real estate market unwind keep bond yields low and local institutions focused on dividend income from financial stocks. At the same time, AI-sensitive sectors are outperforming, buoyed by increased confidence in ongoing domestic innovation. China is focused on developing its own AI technology stack through localisation and open-source large language models to help diffuse AI use across the real economy. Indian structural reforms over the past decade underpin long-term growth. A mid-cycle slowdown in economic and earnings growth is being met with monetary and regulatory easing. After lacklustre equity market performance in 2025, selective opportunities are emerging as the government seeks to revive growth with a consumption stimulus of approximately 2% of GDP. A softer USD, ongoing deficit spending in major economies, and a multi-year AI and infrastructure capex cycle create a constructive backdrop for Asia Pacific equities. Valuations have re-rated; however, earnings should underpin returns as leadership broadens out beyond IT and materials to financials and industrials. While geopolitics remain a persistent overhang, most recently through rising energy prices, risks to growth from tariffs are fading.

The following are among the Fund's approved investment outlets, wherein the Trustee intends to invest depending on strategy, availability, or other market-driven circumstances:

- a) Single collective investment scheme whose investment objective is to achieve long-term capital appreciation by investing in attractively-priced stocks with high dividend yields in the Asia Pacific region; provided further that such CIS is approved or registered and supervised by a regulatory authority that is a member of the International Organization of Securities Commissions (IOSCO) and managed by reputable fund manager/s; provided further that the investment in the said collective investment scheme should at least be ninety percent (90%) of the total assets of the Fund. The Target Fund must be recognized as a collective investment scheme in its home jurisdiction by a regulatory authority or any regulatory authority acceptable to the BSP to supervise this CIS;
- b) Securities issued by or guaranteed by the Philippine government, or by the BSP;
- c) Tradable securities issued or guaranteed by multilateral institutions such as the Asian Development Bank (ADB), International Monetary Fund (IMF) and World Bank;
- d) Tradable securities issued by a government of a foreign country, any political subdivision of a foreign country or any supranational entity;
- e) Marketable instruments that are traded in an organized exchange;
- f) Loans traded in an organized market; and
- g) Money market instruments;
- h) Deposit products;
- i) Such other investments suitable to the nature, classification, and strategy of the Fund, as allowed by prevailing regulations.
