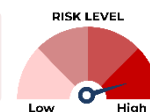

INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND SUMMARY

The Fund, operating as a Feeder Fund, aims to achieve long-term capital appreciation by investing in a Target Fund with a diversified portfolio of attractively-priced stocks with high dividend yields in the Asia Pacific region. The Fund aims to outperform its benchmark which is the MSCI AC Asia Pacific ex-Japan High Dividend Net Return USD Index.

KEY RISKS AND RISK MANAGEMENT

Market/Price Risk: Investors are exposed to adverse changes in the prices of high dividend yield stocks in the Asia Pacific Region, which may be brought about by adverse stock market conditions, unfavorable company earnings and valuations and negative developments in the political and economic conditions of countries in the Asia Pacific Region.

Liquidity Risk: Investors are exposed to the risk of loss due to the target fund's inability to convert equity holdings to cash immediately or in instances where conversion to cash is possible but at a highly disadvantageous price due to limited participants in the market, low trading volumes, market disruptions, among others.

Country Risk: Investors are exposed to the risk of loss arising from negative developments in the political, economic and social conditions of countries in the Asia Pacific region, which may adversely affect the value of the feeder fund.

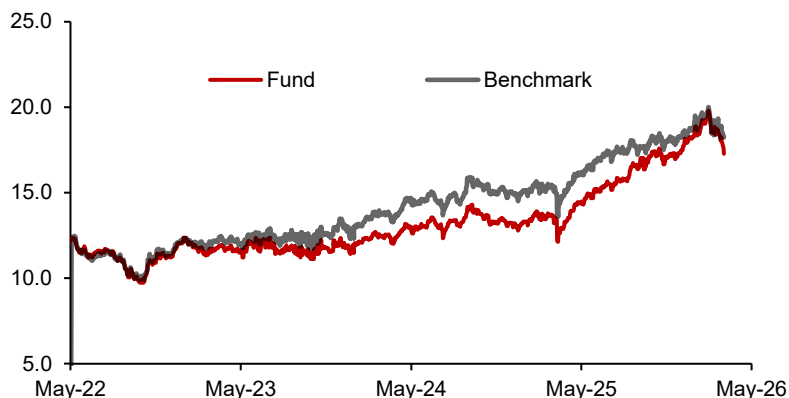

Name: MSCI AC Asia Pacific ex-Japan Net Total Return USD Index

Description and Key Characteristics: The MSCI AC Asia Pacific ex Japan Index captures large and mid cap representation across 4 of 5 Developed Market countries (excluding Japan) and 8 Emerging Market countries in the Asia Pacific region. With 1,192 constituents, the index covers approximately 85% of the free float-adjusted market capitalization in each country.

The index is based on the MSCI Global Investable Market Indexes (GIMI) Methodology —a comprehensive and consistent approach to index construction that allows for meaningful global views and cross regional comparisons across all market capitalization size, sector and style segments and combinations. This methodology aims to provide exhaustive coverage of the relevant investment opportunity set with a strong emphasis on index liquidity, investability and replicability.

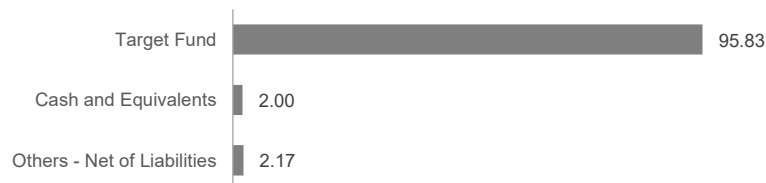
The MSCI Total Return Indices measure the market performance, including price performance and income from regular cash distributions (cash dividend payments or capital repayments). MSCI's Daily Total Return (DTR) methodology reinvests regular cash distributions in indices on the ex-date of such distributions.

Relation to the Fund's Objective or Investment Strategy: The Fund operates as a Feeder Fund. The Target Fund is actively managed and will refer to the benchmark when constructing the portfolio and managing its risk to ensure that the Fund remains aligned with its investment objectives. When selecting investments, the Target Trustee has discretion and is not restricted to the components or weighting of the Index. The Target Fund may invest in securities not included in the Index to take advantage of investment opportunities, subject to the asset class, regional, industry, sector and/or strategy requirements of its investment objectives. Investors may use the Index to measure the performance of the Fund.

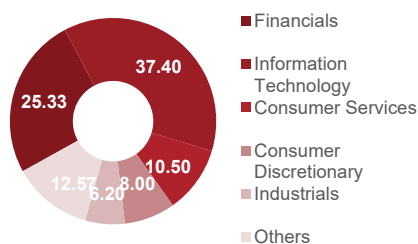

PORTFOLIO COMPOSITION

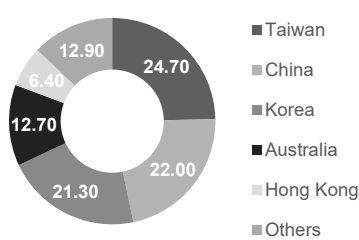
ALLOCATION (%)

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. MSCI AC Asia Pacific ex Japan gained over the month. After weathering a bout of volatility caused by higher rates, normal service was restored in Asian equities later in the month as IT was once again the best-performing sector by far. Korea was the best-performing market during the month, posting the largest gains on strong Q1 2026 earnings and upgrades to forward 12-month (FTM) earnings forecasts. Expectations of a wealth effect from higher equity prices and rising incomes also supported non-tech sectors. Taiwan continued to attract strong foreign inflows in May. FTM EPS forecasts were revised up, although not in the consumer sectors. Indonesia continues to be affected by a lack of investor confidence following MSCI's warning on market transparency. In China, although Internet and technology firms reported resilient earnings (particularly onshore) and reiterated their commitment to future AI capex, non-tech sectors pulled the market lower amid ongoing weakness in consumption. The fund underperformed the benchmark in May. Stock selection and our underweight position in South Korea detracted from performance. SK Hynix and Samsung Electronics were the two largest detractors, as the stocks rose on the AI infrastructure boom, improving memory fundamentals and strong high bandwidth memory (HBM) demand. Not owing to Samsung Electro-Mechanics also detracted, as the company re-rated on its exposure to AI-related components, including MLCCs and silicon capacitors used in AI semiconductors. Within the financials sector, our holdings in Shinhan Financial, along with Hana Financial, lagged as investors rotated into IT names. The largest contributor was SK Inc, a South Korean holding company classified in the Industrials sector. The share price rose following the rally in SK Hynix, which was supported by the AI infrastructure boom. Our underweight position in the Information Technology sector detracted overall, stock selection within a handful of IT holdings made a strong positive contribution, notably our Taiwanese positions in United Microelectronics (UMC), Lite-On Technology and Advantech. UMC rose on the back of strong revenue reports, capacity expansion and a positive growth outlook. Lite-On's share price was supported by strong first-quarter results and demand for its AI server power systems. Advantech also gained amid broader AI-related market enthusiasm. In terms of portfolio activities, we added selectively across semiconductor-related and electronics supply-chain holdings in North Asia, alongside targeted additions to cyclical factory automation and select China themes following stronger results. We also increased exposure where valuations became more compelling, while continuing to recycle capital, realising gains in an upstream energy position. These additions were funded in part by trimming a range of holdings that had performed well and/or were trading on less attractive valuations across Australian consumer defensives, telecoms, real estate, and selected China consumer staples.

Fund Performance. The fund returned 6.94% in May, underperforming the benchmark by 306 basis points. Stock selection and underweight allocation in South Korea along with the overweight allocation to financials detracted the most.

Fund Strategy. A weaker US dollar has supported Asia Pacific equities by easing financial conditions and giving central banks more room to cut rates. We continue to see the potential for a multi-year dollar downcycle, although the Gulf conflict and associated energy-price volatility could delay easing and offer the dollar short-term support. Even so, substantial fiscal support in major economies and a multi-year AI and infrastructure capex cycle have helped keep risk appetite resilient despite the geopolitical overhang. North Asia remains central to the global AI supply chain-spanning compute, testing and packaging, substrates, and networking-supported by Asia's dominant share of semiconductor manufacturing. The memory upcycle remains intact and hyperscaler capex expectations continue to firm, reinforcing the durability of AI-related demand. At the same time, market leadership is increasingly concentrated in a small group of mega-cap names, and valuations in parts of the supply chain have moved to elevated levels. We continue to look for opportunities in adjacent beneficiaries-such as networking, substrates, and power and grid infrastructure-where demand-supply dynamics remain favourable. China remains a two-speed market. Deflationary conditions have kept many domestic investors focused on dividends, but there are tentative signs the deflation cycle may be nearing an inflection point as energy prices rebound and policy efforts address industrial overcapacity. AI-exposed areas continue to outperform amid domestic innovation and a broadening set of technology beneficiaries, while policy remains supportive and regulators continue to normalize competitive behavior in consumer-facing industries. Corporates continue to emphasize shareholder returns through dividends and buybacks. India's medium-term growth remains underpinned by structural reforms, but near-term sensitivity to oil prices is a key watchpoint given energy import dependence and inflation passthrough. Higher energy costs and uncertainty have weighed on more economically exposed areas and pressured margins, while AI-related disruption has been a headwind for parts of IT services. Overall, a softer USD, ongoing fiscal support, and an AI/infrastructure capex cycle underpin a constructive Asia Pacific outlook, with geopolitics and energy prices the main near-term risks.

The following are among the Fund's approved investment outlets, wherein the Trustee intends to invest depending on strategy, availability, or other market-driven circumstances:

- a) Single collective investment scheme whose investment objective is to achieve long-term capital appreciation by investing in attractively-priced stocks with high dividend yields in the Asia Pacific region; provided further that such CIS is approved or registered and supervised by a regulatory authority that is a member of the International Organization of Securities Commissions (IOSCO) and managed by reputable fund manager/s; provided further that the investment in the said collective investment scheme should at least be ninety percent (90%) of the total assets of the Fund. The Target Fund must be recognized as a collective investment scheme in its home jurisdiction by a regulatory authority or any regulatory authority acceptable to the BSP to supervise this CIS;
- b) Securities issued by or guaranteed by the Philippine government, or by the BSP;
- c) Tradable securities issued or guaranteed by multilateral institutions such as the Asian Development Bank (ADB), International Monetary Fund (IMF) and World Bank;
- d) Tradable securities issued by a government of a foreign country, any political subdivision of a foreign country or any supranational entity;
- e) Marketable instruments that are traded in an organized exchange;
- f) Loans traded in an organized market; and
- g) Money market instruments;
- h) Deposit products;
- i) Such other investments suitable to the nature, classification, and strategy of the Fund, as allowed by prevailing regulations.
