INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND SUMMARY

The Fund aims to achieve long-term capital and income growth by investing in a diversified portfolio of fixed income and equity securities. The Fund aims to outperform its benchmark which is composed of 70% BPI Philippine Government Bond Index and 30% PSEi Total Return Index (PSEi TRI).

KEY RISKS AND RISK MANAGEMENT

Interest Rate Risk: The fund invests in short term domestic fixed income securities, exposing investors to the risk of loss arising from rise in interest rates, which generally causes fixed income security prices to decline. Factors/events that may lead to a rise in interest rates include adverse market conditions, issuer-specific factors/events and/or negative developments in domestic political and economic conditions.

Equity Price Risk: Investors are exposed to adverse changes in the prices of stocks listed in the Philippine Stock Exchange, which may be brought about by adverse stock market conditions, unfavorable company earnings and valuations and/ or negative developments in domestic and global political and economic conditions.

Liquidity Risk: Investors are exposed to the risk of loss due to the Fund's inability to convert security holdings to cash immediately or in instances where conversion to cash is possible but at a highly disadvantageous price due to limited buyers/sellers in the market, low trading volumes or market disruptions, among other reasons/ factors

Related Party Risk: Investors are exposed to actual or potential conflicts of interest in the handling of related party transactions by the Trustee, specifically, time deposit placements with the Trustee's own bank and/ or its subsidiary, purchase of debt securities issued by related parties, as well as the execution of trade transactions with related counterparties.

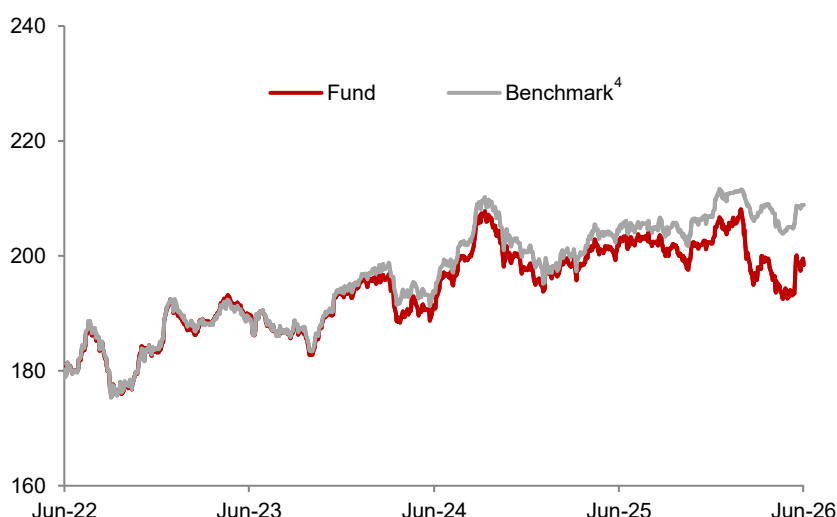

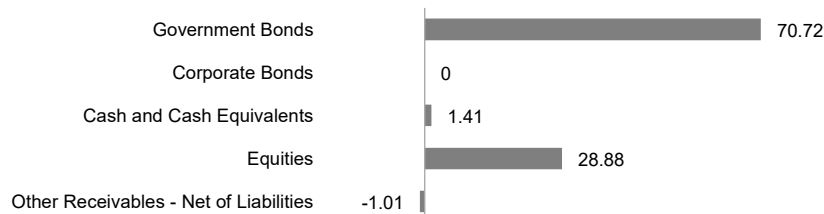
Name	Description and Key Characteristics
PSEi Total Return Index (PSEi TRI)	The Philippine Stock Exchange Index or PSEi is the main index of the Philippine Stock Exchange. The PSEi is a free float-adjusted market capitalization-weighted index of the 30 largest and most active common stock. The PSEi Total Return Index (PSEi TRI) covers both price performance and income from dividend payments by reinvesting cash dividends back to the PSEi according to each constituent's respective market capitalization weightings.
BPI Philippine Government Bond Index	The BPI Philippine Government Bond Index (the BPI Index) is sponsored by the Bank of the Philippine Islands (the Sponsor). The Sponsor is responsible for the design of the BPI Index and the issuance of these Rules. The BPI Index is intended to reflect the performance of Philippine Government, fixed-rate straight bonds denominated in Philippine Peso. It is intended to be a template for passive, diversified fixed income investment portfolios where securities are held in proportion to the market value (Market Capitalization) of the issued securities. It aims to provide accurate and objective benchmarks by which to assess the performance of the Philippine Government bond market.

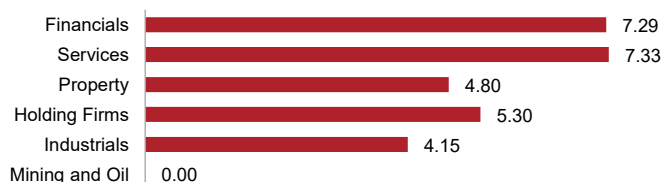

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. Philippine government bond prices rebounded in June as yields declined sharply, supported by improving global risk sentiment and lower oil prices. International oil benchmark prices fell from \$92 to \$73 per barrel following positive developments in US-Iran negotiations, which led to a memorandum of agreement allowing the reopening of the Strait of Hormuz. While oil tanker flows have resumed, volumes remain below pre-conflict levels. Domestic factors also contributed to the rally, as Philippine headline inflation surprised to the downside at 6.8% in May, below market expectations of 7.8%. The decline in oil prices further reinforced expectations of easing inflation pressures. During the month, bond yields fell by an average of 32 basis points, with the 5-year benchmark yield declining from 7.34% to 6.75%. Despite the improvement in yields, investor sentiment remained cautious, with foreign investors recording net outflows of Php11 billion, bringing year-to-date outflows to Php265 billion. The Bureau of the Treasury raised Php160 billion through its regular bond auctions, exceeding its Php140 billion target, as lower yields allowed the government to accept more bids.

The Philippine Stock Exchange Index (PSEi) posted a strong rebound in June, supported by improving investor sentiment amid easing geopolitical tensions in the Middle East, a softer-than-expected domestic inflation print, and a slowdown in foreign selling activity. On the global front, optimism surrounding renewed US-Iran peace talks drove crude oil prices lower for most of the month. It also boosted risk appetite across financial markets despite intermittent volatility as negotiations progressed toward month-end. Domestically, inflation for May came in at 6.8% year-on-year, significantly below the market consensus estimate of 7.8% and the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas' (BSP) forecast range of 7.1% to 7.9%. Despite the benign inflation surprise, the BSP raised its policy rate by 25 basis points to 4.75% and maintained its hawkish policy stance to address lingering inflation risks.

The PSEi advanced 4.65% month-on-month to close at 6,037.17 in June.

Market activity also improved during the period, with average daily value turnover reaching Php6.76 billion, equivalent to an 8.22% increase from the previous month. Foreign selling pressure likewise eased, as net foreign outflows moderated to US\$22 million during the month. Foreign participation remained robust, accounting for 53% of total market activity.

On a stock-specific basis, top gainers for the month include: CNPF (+18.32%), ICT (+18.27%), GLO (+12.31%). Meanwhile top laggards are as follows: DMCI (-17.58%), SCC: (-11.54%), PGOLD (-9.78%).

Fund Performance. The Fund returned 3.04% in June, underperforming the benchmark by 42 basis points. Year-to-date, the Fund declined by -1.84%, underperforming the benchmark by 234 basis points.

Fund Strategy. The Fund will continue to be defensive given the uncertainties globally amidst geopolitical tensions. The Fund's preference is for companies with leading market capitalization, clear earnings growth drivers, dividend-paying and high-yielding. For the fixed income portion, the Fund continues to maintain a nimble portfolio position to take advantage of opportunities as global inflation remains sensitive to supply-side risks, particularly geopolitical tensions in the Middle East and energy market pressures, with potential spillover into broader prices. Volatility may persist in the near term, driven by global factors, and the portfolio will be actively managed to navigate these conditions. Investors in the bond fund must be prepared to withstand short-term price fluctuations, as higher investment value is generally achieved over a medium- to long-term investment horizon.
